

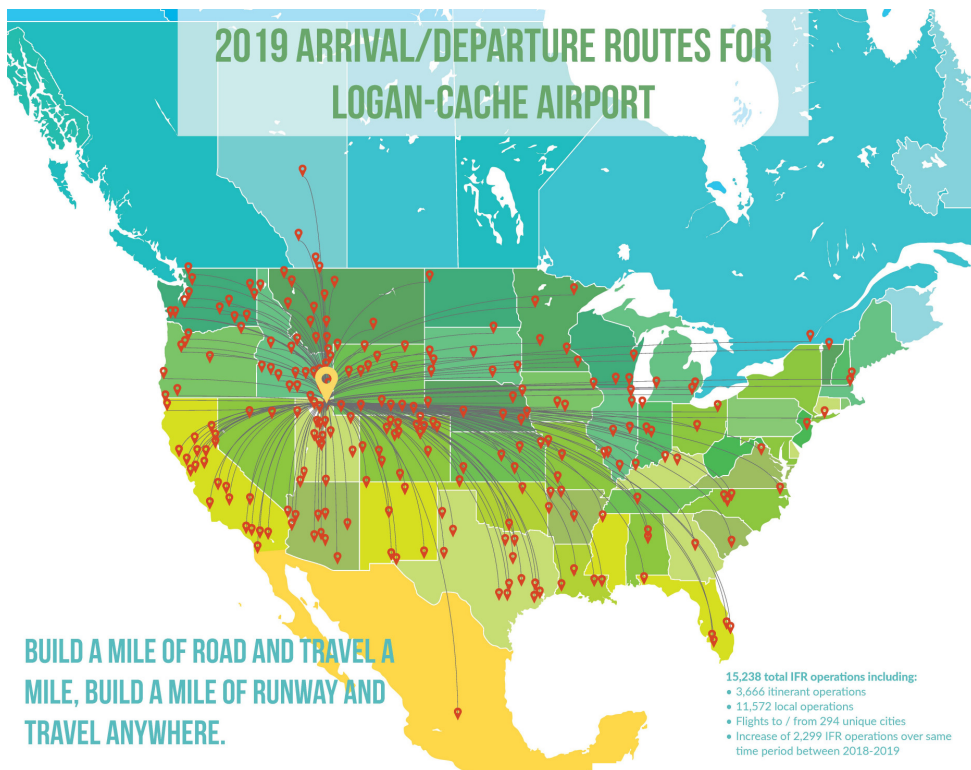

Below is a graphic of the destinations and origins of flights in and out of the Logan-Cache Airport in 2019. There were 15,238 flights classified as IFR or Instrument Flight Rated (required for most categories of executive aircraft and flying in instrument conditions). Of this total, 3,666 were primarily business flights. This is a significant increase over the prior year! It is a stunning picture of the importance of the Logan-Cache Airport as a General Aviation/Business Hub.

The impact to our economy is clear. The most recent publication from The Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association (AOPA) indicates states that every job in General Aviation in this country supports 3.3 additional jobs. Many of the jobs in our valley would not exist if we did not have an airport with facilities to accommodate executive jet business travel!

AND FINALLY, FROM THE AVIATION RUMOR MILL: IT HAS BEEN REPORTED TO US THAT ALL FIVE OF THE EXECUTIVE JETS SOLD BY CESSNA AIRCRAFT IN 2018 WERE INTENDED TO BE BASED AT THE LOGAN-CACHE AIRPORT.
